The Max Planck Institute for Demographic Research is one of the world wide leaders in the study of populations. MaxNetAging, led and coordinated by the Max Planck Institute for Demographic Research, is a network of excellence for the advancement of research on the causes, processes, and consequences of aging (for more information, please see www.maxnetaging.mpg.de).

The Research Coordinator will support the MaxNetAging Director, James W. Vaupel, and advise him on the development of the scientific program. Duties include the organization of international conferences, workshops, and lectures; the coordination of the study program; and communication with the network's partner institutions.

Applicants must have a PhD in the humanities, social sciences or natural sciences, ideally in a subject relevant to aging research. Experience in the management of scientific projects, the acquisition and management of third-party funds, budget planning and personnel management; and an interest in deepening and expanding relevant knowledge and skills is desirable. High proficiency in German and English is required.

The starting date is from February 2016. The position is initially limited to 3 years (until the end of January 2019). Remuneration is at Pay Scale 14 TVöD (the German Wage Agreement for Public Service) and includes employees' benefits in accordance with the Public Service at the federal level.

Applications should include a CV, a letter of motivation including relevant experience in the areas mentioned, and contact details of two referees. Please provide certificates of education, other relevant certificates, and, if applicable, performance records.

The application deadline is **December 13, 2015** at the latest.
